PROGRAMMES AT SCHOOL FOR STUDENTS

RE-OPENING OF PRE-PRIMARY - The academic year 2018-19 commenced on June 4^{th} , 2018 for the preprimary. All the kids marched to the school with a bright smile on their faces. "Rainy Day" was coined as the theme for the day. The lobby and the bulletin boards were decorated with colourful umbrellas. The children along with their parents participated in activities like thumb printing and coloring.

TEACHER ORIENTATION PROGRAM - The teacher orientation program commenced on 21st June with the lighting of the lamp. The team decided to take on 'Improvement' as the theme for the new academic year. Pre-primary, middle school and high school teachers participated in sessions on Blooms taxonomy and neuro science of learning. Mrs. Mamatha Rao, Mrs. Jayashree Mukherjee and Ms. Aarti Rajarathnam were the resource persons.

PARENT ORIENTATION PROGRAM - The parent Orientation Program was held on 2nd June 2018. The parents were briefed on the previous year's academic performance. Teachers highlighted on the new programs introduced in academic year 2018-19 which includes an improved ELEP programme and the Board Prep Programme.

15 BOOKS CAMPAIGN - The 15 Books Campaign was launched on 19th June 2018. The library program for the AY 2018-19 was inaugurated with great aplomb and panache in the school. The theme for the year was 'Travel the World Through Books'. Students dressed in fairy tale costumes heralded the campaign in the school corridors which gave an old English feel. It was a classic way to launch the 15 Book Campaign and this unique launch has attracted most of the students to the library.

WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY - 'Beat plastic pollution' is the theme for this years World Environment Day. The preprimary students were taken for a nature walk and observed the biome around them. Students of Grade 1-2 built a garden out of plastic bottles and learnt the importance of gardening. The students of the junior school took part in various





activities that would help them to internalize the theme. Students of grade 3 - 4 crafted a tote bag from an old T-shirt and learned the importance of reusing. The students were shown a documentary 'Plastic on my Plate' on the harmful effects of plastics. The teachers encouraged the students to use steel tiffin boxes instead of plastic ones.

YOGA DAY - The whole school participated in Yoga day celebration. Students and teachers performed Yogasanas and Pranayama. The students learnt about the importance of practising yoga in their daily life for health and fitness.

CLUB INAUGURATION - The School Club programme was inaugurated on June 22nd, 2018 by Mrs. Mamatha Rao, Regional Lead Academics. The students representing each of the eight clubs shared their views, perceptions, objectives and the activities planned for the year. The clubs include Indoor games, Scouts/ Guides and Cubs /Bulbuls, Speech and Drama, Revival Art, Organic Farming, DIY and Community Service.

EID CELEBRATION - Eid celebration for the preprimary section was held on June 29th, 2018. Children came in festive wear. The teachers performed a skit, "Hamid Ka Chimta" based on Eidgah by Munshi Premchand, delivering the Eid message of compassion. The Little buddies of Prep-II danced together to the tune of 'Give thanks to Allah.'

FATHERS' DAY - Fathers Day was celebrated on June 30th, 2018. The Dads were invited to shake a leg to the rhythmic beats of Zumba. The fathers along with their kids danced to the music very enthusiastically. They participated sportively in the saree draping competition and sashayed on the ramp along with their children. The Dads appreciated the efforts made by the school authorities for this unique idea of involving the fathers in such a celebration.

SCHOOL CABINET ELECTION AND INVESTITURE CEREMONY - The most anticipated event that takes place at the advent of the academic year is the selection of the school cabinet. The school captain and the vice-captain are elected through majority votes. The rest of the cabinet are selected by a board of experienced teachers who select them based on their caliber.

This year the elections were modernized with the scrapping of the ballot paper system and the introduction of electronic voting that is vastly efficient and even better, environmentally friendly.

A total of six contested for the posts of school captain and vice-captain. The election was conducted on the 8th of June and was an enlightening experience for the young voters who participated in the procedures of a democratic election. The candidates canvassed one day prior to the elections, interacting with the students of each class and explaining their goals and aspirations for the school. The candidates represented their ideals through their respective symbols which helped younger students differentiate between each candidate. The election procedure was simple yet effective, the counting of votes was swift and accurate and saved a lot of time and reduced error.

The winners were announced the day after, with Chaitanaya Bhargava and Tanisha Ibrahim emerging as the victors, being awarded the post of captain and vice-captain respectively. The other candidates put up a good competition and are now a part of the newly formed cabinet as opposition members.

The swearing in of the new cabinet formally known as the investiture ceremony takes place a week after the announcement of results, which officially certifies them as the holders of their new position. This event took place on June 21st, 2018 and was graced by the presence of the honourable chief guest, Mr. Vedavyas Kamath, MLA of Mangalore south constituency. The chief guest was welcomed by the guard of honour, a ceremony by which the old cabinet hands over their positions to the new members of the cabinet. The welcome speech was given by Chirag Khandige. The honourable chief guest gave an inspiring speech and displayed the importance of responsibility in the governance of a system. Tanisha Ibrahim, the school vice captain, thanked the audience with a heartfelt end note.

PEARSON AWARDS FOR STUDENT EXCELLENCE - PASE ceremony was conducted on June 21st, 2018. It's an annual award that aims at recognizing children with outstanding performance in academics and co-curricular activities of the previous academic year. This platform has been established with the



objective to encourage children to feel proud and be rewarded for their academic and co-curricular achievements. Students received their awards in the presence of their parents and teachers validating their efforts and hard work. It was a moment of great pride for everyone present that afternoon.
