PROGRAMMES AT SCHOOL

COMMUNITY SERVICE-HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HELD ON JAN 5TH 2017 - The Community Service club of Manipal School, Mangalore took the lead in collecting donation of Rs.1.36 Lakh for Habitat for Humanity India, a non-governmental organisation working to build homes and create sanitation facilities for marginalised communities.

The donations were collected in December, which is observed by the school as a month dedicated to community service.

Mr. Michael D'Souza of Habitat for Humanity India said the money would go into projects being implemented by the NGO in Bengaluru and other parts of the country.

SCIENCE FAIR-JANUARY 9TH 2017 - Manipal School "Science Fair" was conducted in the school on January 9, 2017. The objective was to encourage and inculcate a love for science among students. The event was inaugurated by launching a parachute in the assembly by our Principal & Vice Principal.

Each class had a specific theme and the students had to bring still or working models to demonstrate that theme. Grade 1 brought in models depicting sources of water, Grade 2 had made working models of cars, trucks, cycles etc.. to demo the myriad modes of transport. Grade 4 had made papier mache models of volcanoes. To make the demo more exciting, they mixed food colour, vinegar and baking soda to depict viscous lava pouring out of the volcanoes. Models got more complex in the higher grades. There was even a Lego Mindstorm programmed with motion sensors!

Parents had an opportunity to view the fair. They keenly interacted with students who exuded confidence while explaining to them the various projects and activities that were on display.

This event was a wonderful learning experience for all our students as it helped in enriching their knowledge. The Exhibition was definitely a huge success!
